

Preceptors of the Year Awards

To be awarded at the Annual Preceptors' Dinner

Deadline for receipt of nominations (see announcements)

Description

The Preceptors of the Year Awards include two awards that are presented annually by the Lebanese American University (LAU) School of Pharmacy to two preceptors in forms of recognition plaques. One award is given to a Lebanon-based preceptor who is nominated by current P3 students, and another award given to a U.S.- or Lebanon-based preceptor who is nominated by current P4 students.

Objective

The awards recognize preceptors who are adjunct faculty members of the LAU School of Pharmacy who have shown exemplary commitment and exceptional contributions to the education, mentoring and role modeling for P3 and P4 students during their experiential education on clerkship rotations.

Eligibility and Qualifications

To be eligible for the awards, nominees must:

1. Currently be serving as a preceptor in Lebanon or the U.S. clerkship sites

consistently displays high ethical and moral standards

- 2. Have not previously received the LAU Preceptor of the Year Award within the last three years
- 3. Meet a combination of the following professional and personal qualifications, but not necessarily in all categories:

Advanced Mentoring Skills: demonstrates effective and skilled communication, establishes
clear rotation goals and expectations, encourages student self-directed learning and critical
thinking
Professional Expertise: demonstrates advanced knowledge and professional expertise in the
respective area of pharmacy practice
Commitment to Excellence: is committed to excellence in patient care and active
engagement in professional service
Collaboration: plays a role model for collaboration with the healthcare team and
interdisciplinary approach to patient care
Positive Learning Environment: provides constructive, timely, factual, solution-focused
feedback and assists students to work through challenging experiences
Accessibility: is accessible to students through presence on site and active communication
High Standards of Professionalism: shows respect, patience, and positive attitude and
